After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach, but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he had taken it off, and jumped into the sea. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off. When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred fifty-three of them, and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead. (NRSVUE)

Después de esto Jesús se apareció de nuevo a sus discípulos, junto al lago de Tiberíades. Sucedió de esta manera: Estaban juntos Simón Pedro, Tomás, al que apodaban el Gemelo, Natanael, el de Caná de Galilea, los hijos de Zebedeo y otros dos discípulos. —Me voy a pescar —dijo Simón Pedro. —Nos vamos contigo contestaron ellos. Salieron, pues, de allí y se embarcaron, pero esa noche no pescaron nada. Al despuntar el alba, Jesús se hizo presente en la orilla, pero los discípulos no se dieron cuenta de que era él. —Muchachos, ¿tienen algo de comer? —preguntó Jesús. —No —respondieron ellos. Entonces Jesús dijo: —Tiren la red a la derecha de la barca y pescarán algo. Así lo hicieron y era tal la cantidad de pescados que ya no podían sacar la red. —iEs el Señor! —dijo a Pedro el discípulo a quien Jesús amaba. Tan pronto como Simón Pedro le oyó decir: «Es el Señor», se puso la ropa, pues estaba semidesnudo, y se tiró al agua. Los otros discípulos lo siguieron en la barca, arrastrando la red llena de pescados, pues estaban a escasos cien metros de la playa. Al desembarcar, vieron unas brasas con un pescado encima y un pan. —Traigan algunos de los pescados que acaban de sacar —dijo Jesús. Simón Pedro subió a bordo y arrastró hasta la playa la red, la cual estaba llena de pescados de buen tamaño. Eran ciento cincuenta y tres, pero a pesar de ser tantos la red no se rompió. —Vengan a desayunar —dijo Jesús. Ninguno de los discípulos se atrevía a preguntarle: «¿Quién eres tú?», porque sabían que era el Señor. Jesús se acercó, tomó el pan y se lo dio a ellos e hizo lo

mismo con el pescado. Esta fue la tercera vez que Jesús se apareció a sus discípulos después de haber resucitado. (NVI)

Now Jacob looked up and saw Esau coming, and four hundred men with him. So he divided the children among Leah and Rachel and the two maids. He put the maids with their children in front, then Leah with her children, and Rachel and Joseph last of all. He himself went on ahead of them, bowing himself to the ground seven times, until he came near his brother. But Esau ran to meet him and embraced him and fell on his neck and kissed him, and they wept. When Esau looked up and saw the women and children, he said, "Who are these with you?" Jacob said, "The children whom God has graciously given your servant." Then the maids drew near, they and their children, and bowed down; Leah likewise and her children drew near and bowed down; and finally Joseph and Rachel drew near, and they bowed down. Esau said, "What do you mean by all this company that I met?" Jacob answered, "To find favor with my lord." But Esau said, "I have enough, my brother; keep what you have for yourself." Jacob said, "No, please; if I find favor with you, then accept my present from my hand, for truly to see your face is like seeing the face of God, since you have received me with such favor. Please accept my gift that is brought to you, because God has dealt graciously with me and because I have everything I want." So he urged him, and he took it. Then Esau said, "Let us journey on our way, and I will go alongside you." But Jacob said to him, "My lord knows that the children are frail and that the flocks and herds, which are nursing, are a care to me, and if they are overdriven for one day, all the flocks will die. Let my lord pass on ahead of his servant, and I will lead on slowly, according to the pace of the cattle that are before me and according to the pace of the children, until I come to my lord in Seir." So Esau said, "Let me leave with you some of the people who are with me." But he said, "Why should my lord be so kind to me?" So Esau returned that day on his way to Seir. But Jacob journeyed to Succoth and built himself a house and made booths for his cattle; therefore the place is called Succoth. (NRSVUE)

Cuando Jacob alzó la vista y vio que Esaú se acercaba con cuatrocientos hombres, repartió a los niños entre Lea, Raquel y las dos esclavas. Al frente de todos colocó a las criadas con sus hijos, luego a Lea con sus hijos y, por último, a Raquel con José. Jacob, por su parte, se adelantó a ellos, postrándose en tierra siete veces mientras se iba acercando a su hermano. Pero Esaú corrió a su encuentro y, echándole los brazos al cuello, lo abrazó y lo besó. Entonces los dos se pusieron a llorar. Luego Esaú alzó la vista y, al ver a las mujeres y a los niños, preguntó: — ¿Quiénes son estos que te acompañan? —Son los hijos que Dios ha concedido a tu siervo —respondió Jacob. Las esclavas y sus hijos se acercaron y se postraron ante Esaú. Luego, Lea y sus hijos hicieron lo mismo y por último también se postraron José y Raquel. —¿Qué significan todas estas manadas que han salido a mi encuentro? —preguntó Esaú. —Intentaba que me trataras bien, mi señor — contestó Jacob. —Hermano mío —repuso Esaú—, ya tengo más que suficiente. Quédate con lo que te pertenece. —No, por favor —insistió Jacob—; si he logrado

que me trates bien, acepta este presente que te ofrezco. Ya que me has recibido tan bien, iver tu rostro es como ver a Dios mismo! Acéptame el regalo que te he traído. Dios ha sido muy bueno conmigo y tengo más de lo que necesito. Fue tanta la insistencia de Jacob que, finalmente, Esaú aceptó. Más tarde, Esaú le dijo: — Sigamos nuestro viaje, yo te acompañaré. Pero Jacob se disculpó: —Mi hermano y señor debe saber que los niños son todavía muy débiles, y que las ovejas y las vacas acaban de tener cría, y debo cuidarlas. Si les exijo demasiado, en un solo día se me puede morir todo el rebaño. Es mejor que mi señor se adelante a su siervo, que yo seguiré al paso de la manada y de los niños, hasta que nos encontremos en Seír. —Está bien —accedió Esaú—, pero permíteme dejarte algunos de mis hombres para que te acompañen. —¿Para qué te vas a molestar? —contestó Jacob—. Lo importante es que me has tratado bien. Aquel mismo día, Esaú regresó a Seír. Jacob, en cambio, se fue hacia Sucot, y allí se hizo una casa para él y cobertizos para su ganado. Por eso a ese lugar se le llamó Sucot. (NVI)
